

Protocol 2.3:

Adhere to analysis parameters

- Definition of acute food and nutrition security
- Inform action with short-term strategic objectives
- 5 severity phases to assess acute food and nutrition insecurity
- The 20% rule
- Convergence of evidence
- Analysis unit
- Validity period of analysis
- Classification of current and projected situations
- Identification of areas receiving humanitarian food assistance

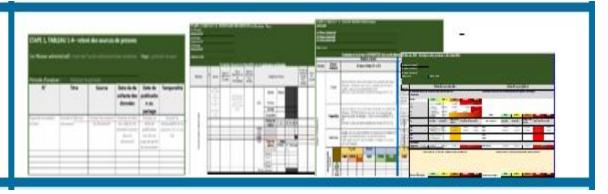

Protocol 2.6: Adhere to minimum analysis requirements

- Minimum evidence for classification
- Identification of limiting factors
- Justification (conclusion) on phase classification
- Monitoring assumptions related to risk factors for the projected situation
- Estimation of populations
